Adolescent Behaviors and Experiences Survey, 2021

- According to the CDC, more than one in three high school students (37.1%) experienced poor mental health during the COVID-19 pandemic.
- In addition, 44.2% of students experienced persistent feelings of sadness or hopelessness, almost 20% seriously considered suicide, and 9.0% attempted suicide during the 12 months before the survey.

Adolescent Behaviors and Experiences Survey, 2021

 The prevalence of poor mental health and suicidality was high across students of all sex, sexual identity, and racial and ethnic groups; however, poor mental health, persistent feelings of sadness or hopelessness, and suicidal thoughts and behaviors were less prevalent among those who felt close to persons at school.

Legislative Updates

House Bill (HB) 899 Mental Health of Students

- Any students referred to a school-based or community-based mental health services provider for mental health screening for the identification of mental health concerns and students at risk for mental health disorders are assessed within 15 days of referral.
- School-based mental health services must be initiated within 15 days after identification and assessment.
- Community-based mental health services must be initiated within 30 days after the school or district makes a referral.
- Parents of a student receiving services are provided information about other behavioral health services available through the student's school or local community-based behavioral health services providers. This may be met by providing information about and Internet addresses for web-based directories or guides for local behavioral health services.
- Districts must provide individuals living in a household with a student receiving services information about behavioral health services available through other delivery systems or payers for which such individuals may qualify if such services appear to be needed or enhancements in those individuals' behavioral health would contribute to the improved well-being of the student.

House Bill (HB) 590 Involuntary Examination Reporting System

- Requires each school to comply with the reporting of involuntary examinations as identified in s. 1006.07(10), F.S.

- 48-Hours after Involuntary Examination takes place to enter information IERS.



House Bill (HB) 1421-School Safety

- Safe-school officers that are sworn law enforcement officers to complete mental health crisis intervention training and requiring safeschool officers that are not sworn law enforcement officers to receive training on incident response and deescalation.
- That school district and local mobile response teams use the same suicide screening tool approved by the DOE (Banyan Healthcare System).

House Bill (HB) 1421 - Threat Assessment Comprehensive School Threat Assessment Guidelines

- Identify Threat Assessment Team (Survey to Follow)
- Team Member Training (September 2022)
- Introduce Threat Assessment Team at Opening of Schools
- Threat to Others
- Convening the Team
- Classifications (No Threat, Transient, Substantive)
- Documentation-DSIS (M1 Code), 7719-Fillable form, School Safety Collaboration Site
- Follow up support services

- Youth Mental Health First Aid
 - Required for all staff to be trained in the State of Florida per HB 1412
 - 80% of school staff should be train by July 2023 and each year thereafter
 - Certification should be maintained
- 90-minute recertification opportunities offered for those that already completed the course
